DYNAMITED CAVE GATED

As of November 1, 1968, Dynamited CAve in the Mt. Adams area has been gated. The gate was placed well within the cave, just before the narrow section of the passage beyond the entrance room. It is of iron mesh-rebar construction, similar to the gate on Little Red River Cave in the Mt. St. Hellens area. The Forest Service, who installed the gate, also plans on the installation of two warning signs; one of them listing phone numbers which may be called to gain permission for entering the cave. Two locks have been placed on the gate in series; one supplied by the Forest Service and one by the Portland Grotto. The CAscade Grotto has a key to the latter lock.

It should be pointed out that onyone in the cave without permission from either the CAscade Grotto or the Oregon Grotto is in violation of federal law. Thus we have a responsibility to assure that the cave is properly locked at all times and that the key is not duplicated.

Permission to enter the cave cannot -- I repeat -- CAN NOT be obtained from the Forest Service in Trout Lake. Therefore if you are planning a trip to Dynamited, be sure that you have arranged to get the key ahead of time and have it with you when you get there.

When I left that porous karst commonwealth of Kentucky, Iwas sure that my knee pads would deteriorate before another opportunity to use them arose. This quickly tunned out to be false as I outfitted a small group for a frontal attack on the caves of the Snoqualamie Pass area. Jerry Kilner, Leon Cerniway and I studied the CAVES OF WASHINGTON and decided on Newton CAve as a good objective. The caves are excellently described in the book with small maps and dimensions called out. However, the exact location of the caves was rather nebulous to a stranger to the region.

Newton CAve and the other caves of Snoqualamie Pass are in "Cave Ridge", whereever that is. Cave Ridge turned out to be about 2000 ft. above the pass. This makes Cow CAve seem like it is in downtown CArter City.

The sunday we had chosen was a rainy one in Seattle (surprise). What rain we avoided from the sky was convergently dumped on us from the North Cascades brush. But the day was considered a major success because we found Cave Ridge. The three caves we located were rather unproductive, but there are more there waiting when we are again ready for the climb.

Of the three caves, the first one went only about 15 feet. The second, Prospectors CAve, had a nine inch entrance which we were about to negotiate when a small marmot chased us clear off wive Ridge. I've never seen so little mass move so much that the third with was at the bottom of the ridge and had a beautiful ceiling that is typical of the caves in the area. Here time and three rather large piles of feces turned us back after only about fifteen-foot penetration.

Did I say a major success? Well, at least my knee pads aren't deceriorating.
