MEETING NOTES

THE NOVEMBER MEETING had twelve attendees. \$23 was appropriated to pay for the July Cascade Caver, and \$40 to the editor for current and future expenses. Nominations for next year's officers were: Chairman, Bob Brown; Vice-Chairman, Kevin Allred and Wes Gannaway; Treasurer, Craig Hansen. Chuck Fair was voted next year's Storekeeper. A raise in dues was proposed (see October issue, p. 80). Program was the Dallas-Fort Worth Grotto's very amusing "Caving Safety" slide show.

The following revised sections of the Grotto Operating Policy were approved!

- G. It shall be Grotto policy to operate a Grotto Store, the purpose of which shall be the sale and rental of caving equipment. The Grotto Store shall be managed by a Storekeeper appointed by the Grotto membership. The Storekeeper has complete authority to manage the store subject only to his removal by the Grotto membership. Any net profit from the sale or rental of equipment shall be distributed as per item H.
- H. In order to raise funds for the purchase of merchandise for the store, the storekeeper is authorized to sell "store certificates". Only Cascade Grotto members may be certificate holders. Net profit from the store shall be distributed in the following manner:
 - 1. 20% certificate holder dividends.
 - 2. 20% certificate buyback fund.
 - 3. 40% reinvestment in store.
 - 4. 20% to Grotto treasury.

THE DECEMBER MEETING witnessed the outcome of the Trip Report Contest. Winner by a landslide was "Another Windy Creek Cave Trip Report", by Kevin and Carlene Allred, published in the September issue. No business was conducted.

The January Meeting was well attended. The Grotto voted in the third of the three dues increase proposals, so dues are now \$7.50 regular & associate, \$6.00 subscription, and \$1.50 family. The program was a Halliday and Allred collaboration on Hawaiian caves, both lava tube and limestone.

About This Issue

The last Cascade Caver was mailed in November and many members have been asking, when will the next <u>Caver</u> be mailed? You are now looking at the product of that question. The last few Cavers have been delayed due to our editors involvement with the NWRA Symposium, work, and school. Yes even Rod works from time to time! This is the first Caver (3 Pages), the next caver will be mailed from Eastern Washington by March 14 (6 Pages), and Rod will have the March 1980 Cascade Caver printed and mailed before the end of the month. Review 79 - Preview 80

The Cascade Grotto had a very good year last year! Meeting formate and programs were improved. The club developed a new operating policy which spells out the duties and responsibilites of each of the grotto officers as well as the Cascade Caver editor. If you have not read this operating policy take a look at it! Not only did eastern Washington members double the mapped length of Gardner Cave to over 2000 feet, they also started an Eastern Washington Unit of the Cascade Grotto. At the same time eastern Washington members were mapping Gardner Cave, Western Washington members were at work mapping Windy Creek Cave, resulting in 3057 feet of mapped passage (triple the length from the beginning of this summer). Grotto membership increased to 62 members (4] regular) and has stayed constant. Grotto members also found several new caves and our lead file has also increased. Our cave register and sign program got off to a very good start with installation of more than a dozen registers and signs throughout the state. There were trips almost every weekend May--October, with more than one trip on many of the summer weekends. Yes, a very good year indeed! Thanks to the many members which helped throughout the year,

The year ahead looks very good. The Grotto started the year off by sponsoring the NWRA Symposium on Cave Science and Technology at the Burke Museum. This symposium held over the Presidents' Day Weekend (Febuary 16-18) was well attended with over 75 people registering. The Grotto will sponsor this event again next year! Mapping and digging in Windy Creek and Gardner Caves, ariel reconnaissance of the eastern Washington limestone areas, and lead checking should result in new caves and new passage. A long term field trip schedule will be finalized at the April 15th Grotto meeting, we need your input. The year ahead looks very good, get involved in your clubs activities.
